If you live in Nottinghamshire you **MUST** apply for a school place. The information on our website (www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk) and the Admissions to Schools, Guide for Parents gives more detail about the admissions application process and individual school information. This guide is available on our website, at local schools and Customer Service Points.

Remember that attendance at a linked infant school or living in the catchment area does not guarantee entry to the junior school at Year 3 and you must still apply for a school place.

Apply on-line - the easiest way to apply is on-line at www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk/schooladmissions

Using your child's UID number printed on this leaflet. You will need to register to get a password which you will need to change the first time you log in. When you have submitted your application you will receive an immediate email acknowledgement. On offer day 13 April 2012 you will receive an email detailing the outcome of your preference request(s).

You must submit an application and any other supporting information before the closing date of 15 January 2012.

If you are applying for a place at an own admission authority school (foundation, voluntary aided, trust or academy) you may be required to complete a supplementary form. Also, some voluntary controlled schools may require supporting information from a minister, please check the school's oversubscription criteria for more details. Supplementary information is used by the respective admission authority in considering applications against its own admission criteria. Whilst the supplementary form is not in itself a legal application, it is extremely important that where supplementary forms are part of an oversubscription criteria they are completed in order for own admission authorities to consider your application fully. This information should be provided at the time of completing the common application, you can email this to us at admissions.ed@nottsc.gov.uk.

You must notify the School Admissions Team in writing of any change of address – we will need proof that you are living at your new address before we are able to update our information.

Things to consider when making your application

- Do you know your linked junior school?
- Some own admission authority arrangement definitions may differ from those of Nottinghamshire County Council - it is important therefore that you read their oversubscription criteria carefully (e.g. siblings, home address, etc).
- Do you know which catchment area you live in? You can check this on our website (www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk)
- Have you requested school brochures? It may also be possible to arrange a school visit.
- Have you thought about transport and how your child will get to and from school?
- Remember if you live in Nottinghamshire you need to apply to Nottinghamshire even if your preferred school is in another area. We will then send details of your request to the relevant admission authority for consideration against their published admission criteria – remember to check whether you also need to complete a supplementary form
- All your preferences are considered equally so it is important that you name the schools in the order you most prefer them – we will offer you a place at the highest preferred school possible
- We recommend you use all your 4 preferences. If you cannot be offered any of your preferences, the Local Authority may allocate a place at the next nearest community or voluntary controlled school with places available. You will not automatically be offered a place at your catchment area school
- It is very important that you tell us if your child has any special educational need or particular social circumstances that may affect your application, please let us know at the time of your application in order that your preferences can be considered fully - you will need to send any written supporting information from a professional when making your application
- Tell us about any brothers or sisters who will be attending your preferred school, or the linked infant/junior school in September 2012
- Read information on performance tables (www.education.gov.uk), OFSTED reports (www.ofsted.gov.uk)

Remember that attending the linked infant school, living in the catchment area, or having a brother or sister attending a school does not guarantee that your application will be successful.
