

Introduction to Safeguarding Children

This is an introductory course about safeguarding children, explaining the worker's role and responsibilities in the protection and safeguarding of children and the provision of service to children in need.

The half day course explains the signs and symptoms of the four categories of abuse and what to do if worried about the welfare of a child or family.

Target group

Paid and unpaid workers from statutory and voluntary organisations who are unable to access in-house introductory safeguarding children training.

Colleagues from NSCB partner agencies

Eligibility criteria

You may attend if similar training is not provided by the organisation you work for.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the course we would hope participants would be able to;

- Define the categories of abuse
- Demonstrate an awareness of the indicators of abuse
- Understand their personal and organisational responsibility to report concerns
- Identify what actions they would need to take to report concerns
- Understand the concepts of vulnerable children, children in need and children in need of protection
- Understand their responsibilities towards children in need as well as need of protection
