

## Kilton Children's Centre Community Consultation Key findings

### Who we consulted:

We interviewed 83 people in total:



- 40% of you were aged under 29 years
- 47% of you were aged between 30 and 39
- 93% of you were female
- 84% of you have children under 5

We invited 10 people to a focus group, held at St Augustine's school Nursery, where we asked some more detailed questions.

Thanks to those parents who attended and helped us get a much clearer picture of the highs and lows of being a parent and child living in Kilton.

### The services you are currently using:

The services you use most are:

- GP Practice (used by 89% of you)
- Health Visitors (by 86% of you),
- Midwife (by 76% of you)

The services for children that you use most are:

- Nursery in a school (66%)
- Family members for childcare (58%)
- Children's Library service (48%)
- Pre-school Playgroup (48%)
- Toddler Group (40%)



- Of all the services, you feel that the Nursery in a School is the most useful and is also one of the most child-friendly.

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### Making Kilton better for families



- You would use services more often if they were at different times, if the price was better and if childcare was available.
- You find that written information is the best way of finding out about services
- Some of you would welcome more Toddler Groups and other activities for very young children.
- Many of you feel that a Children's Centre will give you and your child the chance to mix with others and try out new activities
- Many of you would like the opportunity to use services more flexibly, including during evenings and weekends
- When we asked you what three things you think Kilton needs to make it better for parents with young children, you asked for:
  - play and leisure activities for all children**
  - support for parents and opportunities to meet**
  - public places that are clean, welcoming and safe**
- Another improvement you suggested was more readily accessible advice at all stages of child-rearing
