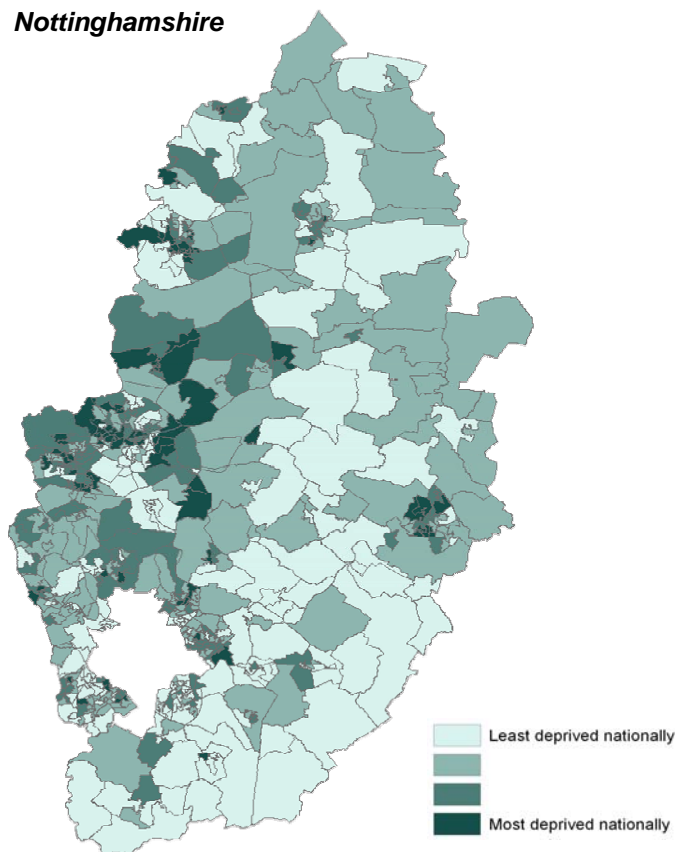

Children living in poverty*

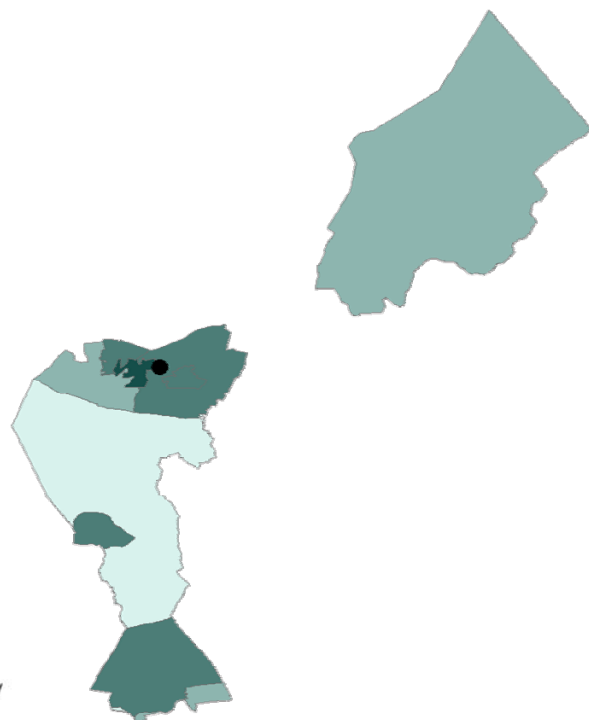

Serlby Park



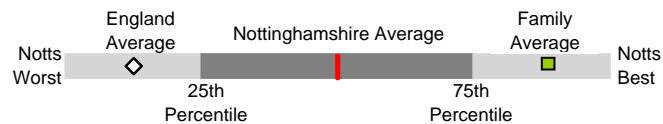
This map shows the differences in the levels of child poverty in the area surrounding Serlby Park. The location of the secondary school is shown by the black dot.
